

NATIONAL TAIWAN UNIVERSITY

General Waste Management Regulations

January 19, 2010 Passed by the 2,608th Administrative Meeting
February 17, 2014 Passed by the 2,799th Administrative Meeting

- Article 1 The National Taiwan University (NTU or “the University”) *General Waste Management Regulations* (“the Regulations”) are formulated to help conserve natural resources, reduce waste, encourage recycling, lessen the University’s impact on the environment, and foster sustainability on campus.
- Article 2 The provisions herein shall apply to all administrative units, academic units, and dormitories on the Main Campus.
- Article 3 The term “waste” herein shall refer to general waste and recyclable materials.
- Article 4 Recyclable materials such as waste paper, steel/tin/aluminum cans, plastics, plastic bottles, aluminum foil-coated paper cartons (Tetra Paks), and appliances shall be sorted and recycled in accordance with the recycling guidelines announced by the Taipei City Government.
- Article 5 Waste shall be placed in an NTU-issued special purpose trash bag with a tracking number that can be traced back to the waste-generating unit to be collected for disposal. The specifications and prices of NTU-issued special purpose trash bags shall be stipulated by the General Service Division of the Office of General Affairs.
- Article 6 Revenue from sales of NTU-issued special purpose trash bags shall be deposited in the University Endowment Fund to be used towards environmental protection-related expenditures.
- Article 7 Disposing of any form of waste generated outside of the University on campus areas or into campus trash cans is strictly prohibited.
- Article 8 Contractors shall be responsible for handling any general waste produced during construction or maintenance projects and may not dispose of such waste on campus.
- Article 9 The competent managing units of the University shall be responsible for the monitoring and inspection of whether waste is sorted properly, as well as whether there is waste being disposed of in inappropriate locations, other materials are disposed of as general waste, and outside garbage is brought onto campus. Those found in violation of relevant regulations may be penalized in accordance with the University’s *Directives Governing Follow-Up Measures for Laboratories and Non-Laboratory Units in Violation of Environmental Protection and Occupational Safety and Health Regulations*.
- Article 10 Matters not addressed herein shall be handled in accordance with applicable regulations.

Article 11 The Regulations shall be passed by the Environmental Protection and Occupational Safety and Health Committee and the Administrative Meeting and then implemented on the date of promulgation.
